Richard raised the YBKA suggested statement for use by districts re-imported of honeybees "As an affiliate of both the British Beekeepers Association and Yorkshire Beekeepers Association, (district beekeepers association) discourages the importation of both honey bee queens and colonies from outside the UK; and asked if it's a statement we want to use as an association, packages of bees cannot be imported but queens can be, JC has mixed thoughts that UK queens can't be readily available early enough, PK suggested this is more of an impact to commercial beekeepers. RS suggested another option of wording is to check where queens are being imported from. To be deferred until next meeting for a vote. VF suggested we encourage members to breed bees where possible via meetings and education i.e. queen rearing sessions.

Association Apiary update – all 6 colonies survive and made it through the winds, all on new stands, scaffolding poles required to repair the fence if any members have any available. Area has been tidied up and looks really good. 6 colonies was original agreement, original aim was to create some nucs for sale to members. If no poles are available association can look into buying some. Also suggested the picnic table is removed and a new one purchased.
